- The 2022 Annual Financial Report has been completed; bound copies were received and delivered to all board members so they have time to review and gather questions before Auditors attend the June 12 Board Meeting to formally present the report.
- Staff is preparing additional documentation for the DuPage County Tourism Grant; since the
 award was less than originally requested, the scope of the project has been adjusted <u>not</u> to
 include an irrigation system and revised grant documents are required. We have been put
 on HOLD as the grant administrators *may have additional funding* on top of the \$37,637
 already awarded.
- Finance staff wired a bond payment on May 1 in accordance with our debt schedule totaling \$640,798.75. The District collects taxes sufficient to make all bond payments.
- 2023 Personal Property Replacement Taxes; YTD \$97,447.64, 40.6% of budget;

- The following deposits/reimbursements were received:
 - o \$2,309 PDRMA claim-Red Hawk Sprinkler Repair
 - o \$500 PDRMA Loss Control Incentive 2023, 1st of 3 possible payments
 - o \$350.41 Felco vending commission
 - o \$1,418.60 PepsiCo vending commission
- Donations/In-Kind Trade Value
 - o LOWES Secured a Cordless Leaf Blower in exchange for sponsorship Valued at \$300.
 - CORT Furniture: Secured 6 piece seating area and two wall décor items in exchange for Advertising – Value \$ 2,080.







• Coyote Crossing Mini Golf opening day was May 6. Total revenue for the weekend was \$1,081 with 150 admissions.







- Interest Earnings Finance staff diversifies investments to accommodate spending needs,
 FDIC investment limits, and best interest earnings:
 - 2023 interest received from IPrime (PMA) for capital dollar investments YTD are \$32,128.75.
 - 2023 interest received from IPrime (PMA) for capital repair/replacement dollar investments YTD are \$2,027.91.
 - o 2023 interest through Fifth Third Bank for fund balance dollars:
 - \$2.75M in Government Agency Discount Notes to mature August 25, 2023 at a
 4.754% yield, with estimated interest of \$52,002.56.
 - YTD received from 5/3 Liquid & Treasury Investments are \$50,122.50.
- 3 Month Summer Member special has sold 55 memberships to date; this special concludes at the end of June.

Strategic Goal and Initiative #3

Operate Parks and Facilities Efficiently

- Staff met with Wayne Township to begin discussions on revisions to the intergovernmental agreement that covers usage of the Township parking lot for patrons of Redhawk Park. The agreement does not expire until March 2024.
- SRC Registration Services Desk will open longer hours when Summer Camp starts to accommodate the summer participants.

Strategic Goal and Initiative #4

Meet Needs of Changing Community Demographics

• The Community Needs Assessment hit homes in mid-May with the Library's Newsletter. At the same time, the District released the electronic version via social media, electronic media, emailed to entire District customer database, website, and QR code. An additional email version of the survey will be sent to all non-resident users to capture that market as well. We appreciate the Board to providing their availability for individual Board interviews. Focus groups have been developed, staff is refining the questions, and preparing meeting logistics.

Strategic Goal and Initiative #5

Develop Parks and Facilities

- Walter Park kick off planning meeting with Wight & Co was held on May 18 to review project timeline. Project will be bid in late summer for fall construction.
- Community Park construction will begin as soon as the County verifies that all paperwork submitted by Construction Inc.
- Park On The Green COMPLETE!
- May 15 Veterans Memorial Plaza: Brick installation was completed in time for Memorial Day Service.



 Administration staff worked with consultant to prepare a Bike Trail Grant through the Illinois Department of Natural Resources that would support 50% (up to \$200,000) for the redevelopment of the Veterans Park Trail/Bike Path. If successful, this project will be the last major Park District trail slated for repair. A public meeting was held on May 11 at Fountain View Recreation Center to gather community input. The grant application was submitted May 15.

• Staff continues work with the Village of Carol Stream to create an Intergovernmental Agreement for the Klein Creek Shoreline Stabilization project through Armstrong Park.

Foster a Safe and Welcoming Environment

• Camp Welcome Night is scheduled for May 22. Campers and their parents can stop by the open house to meet staff, ask questions, and try out some of our favorite camp activities; 56 campers are currently registered to attend the free event.

Strategic Goal and Initiative #8

Highest Quality Staff & Team

- All full-time staff, and any staff handling cash, or processing payments are participating in annual training on strengthening internal controls and fraud awareness. This training is provided by Lauterbach & Amen at no cost to the District.
- As of May 15, the Parks Department has reached staffing levels similar to June 2018, with a new summer seasonal staff member also starting that day.
- Recreation Attendants will bring back "staff vests" as part of their uniform for each shift at McCaslin and Armstrong Park.
- Recreation Supervisor held a Lead Swim Instructor Training on May 2 with all current lead instructors. During the meeting, expectations were established going into summer season, addressed concerns, and received an update on the new staff.
- Quarterly training for the Rental Host Team took place on May 10. The staff training included AV training, rental policies, and staff safety.
- Quarterly training for the Birthday Party Team took place on May 15. The staff was trained on our outdoor birthday parties including Coyote Crossing Mini Golf and Coral Cove Water Park birthday parties.
- Training for the Coral Cove Water Park Concessions staff was on May 11. The agenda included new staff introductions, POS and cash handling training, code of conduct, and cleaning/stocking protocols.
