- Walter Park construction continues at Walter Park. All old amenities have been removed, the trail has been cut, all ballfield mix has been removed and excavating the rest of the site has begun. The contractor continues to pace on time for this project with a completion date schedule approximately Memorial Day Weekend.
- Community Park work in the field has begun again. Fine grading has begun, garden plots were installed, excess soil is being trucked off site and turf/fencing is coming soon around the futsal court.
- Playgrounds will receive new certified playground mulch by April 30.

- Participation numbers in popular fitness classes continue to increase with an average of nine participants per class.
- The 500 Mile Challenge began on January 1 and has 124 members participating. Of aforementioned participants, 30 have completed 125 miles, 4 have completed 250 miles and 2 have completed 375 miles.
- The February Member Challenge began on February 1 with 143 members signing up. 93 of these members completed the challenge; Robert V. was the monthly challenge winner.



- The March Member Challenge asked members to complete a fitness bracket for three different areas of fitness; Fitness Center, Group Fitness Class, and Pool/Track. There are currently 64 all-inclusive members signed up to participate.
- Springers Gymnastics Team kicked off optional meet season on March 3 with five teams and 70 gymnasts. Jr. Bronze: 3rd place, Bronze: 2nd place, Silver: 1st place.

- Frozen Theatre Performance tickets went on sale on March 4. Due to having to hold the shows in the small auditorium this season, there are about 80 tickets left per show and a sellout is anticipated.
