Strategic Goal and Initiative #1

Take Care of What We Have

- Direct Fitness Solutions returned March 25 and April 8 to perform repairs determined necessary during Preventative Maintenance visit.
- Fitness Supervisor installed 4 new indoor cycle seats and 1 equipment pad.



Improve Financial Position

- 2023 Tax Levy allocation received from County reflected a higher EAV than estimated, at a rate of
 increase just over 105% of the actual taxes collected the previous year. The District will end up leaving
 \$3500 of eligible taxes "on the table".
- Deposits received:
 - \$120,000 reimbursement from the Village of Carol Stream for expenses related to the Armstrong Park barn replacement.
 - The District has been reimbursed \$2,248 by TAAG, LLC for the first payment of services to restore trespass damage.
 - We received \$37,637.52 from the State of Illinois DCEO grant for the Tourism Grant which supported the artificial turf replacement at McCaslin.
- 2024 interest received to date:
 - IL Trust Fund Balance Money YTD \$ 12,805.61
 - o Fifth Third Bank Fund Balance Money \$36,599.57
 - o IPrime (PMA) Capital Money YTD \$15,214.26
- Frozen theatre performances had four sold-out shows, with 290 attendees each, in the GBN small auditorium, generating \$11,600 in ticket sales. Concessions, merchandise, raffles, and candy grams brought in \$1,645 in revenue.
- Springers Home Gymnastics Meet on April 7 brought in \$1,462 in admissions, raffle, and concessions revenue.
- Lacrosse was scheduled to start on April 1, and will bring about \$4,250.
- A basketball tournament at Fountain View over the weekend of April 6-7, and brought in \$2,205 in revenue.
- Fountain View Concessions was open for a Swim Conference on March 16. Total gross revenue was \$744.
- Fountain View Concessions was open for a One Day Shootout Basketball Tournament April 6-7. Total gross revenue was \$1,107.
- McCaslin Home Plate Concessions was open for a One Nation Survivor Weekend Adult Softball Tournament March 16-17. Total gross revenue was \$5,750.
- McCaslin Home Plate Concessions was open for a Youth Baseball Seminole Tournament April 5-6. Total gross revenue was \$2,271.
- Two Garba rentals have been booked for the Fall of 2024 at the Fountain View Recreation Center. Anticipated revenue will be over \$6,000.
- Spring Fling Breakfast & Egg Hunt event was held on March 23 at Fountain View Recreation Center. A total of 125 attended.
- 36 March Spring Break One-Week memberships were sold compared to 72 in 2023.
- Five members took advantage of the Personal Training 10% discount in March, 4 returning clients and 1 new client.

• 1,195 Before & After Care daily flex passes have been sold compared to 1,276 this time last year. The program is serving 232 individual registrants.







• Preschool Spring Break Mini Camps took place from March 25-29. There were a total of 65 registrants over the course of the week.







• There were six days of spring break Days Off Club, with 296 registrations between Before Care, Days Off Club, and After Care. Highlights included are Bob Ross Day, Pajama & Movie Day, a magic show, and field trips to Funway, Enchanted Castle, and Bartlett Pool.





• The Luck of the Irish adult trip took place on March 14 with 11 participants.



• Springers Gymnastics Team placed first in the Junior Bronze and first in the Bronze levels on April 7. Gymnastics also achieved many personal best scores. The meet had a slumber party theme.



 A new soccer camp will run prior to the soccer season starting on Sunday, April 14, and currently has 22 kids enrolled.

- We are currently running an all-girls 3/4 grade soccer team, a first since pre-COVID.
- Spring Fling Breakfast & Egg Hunt event was held on March 23 at Fountain View Recreation Center. A total of 125 attended.







• Flashlight Egg Hunt was held on March 28 at Coyote Crossing Mini Golf; total of 240 children participated.





- Participation numbers in popular group fitness classes continue to increase with an average of nine participants per class.
- The 500 Mile Challenge began on January 1 and has 165 members participating. So far, three members completed 500 miles in March.
- The March Member Challenge began on March 1 with 65 members participating in the challenge. All-Inclusive members were asked to participating in three different types of workouts at the fitness center, including Group Fitness class participation. Larry E. was our March challenge winner.
- The April Member Challenge asked members to complete 12 workouts in the month of April. We currently have 99 all-inclusive members participating.

- A recreation department brainstorming meeting was held on April 5 to generate new ideas for future seasons.
