- The Registration Manager tested the set up for the 2024/2025 Activkids Before and After Care program in Active Net and worked with the Recreation Manager to come up with a more efficient payment plan set up.
- Registration team has been busy calling participants from the camp waitlist to enroll into the program.
- Registration team has been working over the past couple months to convert over a thousand memberships from an individual set up to a family set up in Active Net.
- PDF Guide April 24 Summer guide is published via ISSUU and linked throughout the website
  and mobile app. Announcement made via Constant Contact and social media. Copies were
  made for the front desk binders. Mondlock is sending the marketing campaigns list to staff April
  26. Seven start-of-season eblasts (sales/promos/deadlines) were staggered the week of April
  22.

- Spring Dance Recital tickets went on sale to participants on April 15. So far, 738 tickets have been sold. Tickets go on sale to the public on May 1.
- Forte Dance Company & Storm Poms Team attended their first competition of the year. Both teams placed in the top 1-6 for various awards of dances and special awards.





Before & After Care has 836 school year registrations compared to 861 this time last year. 1,306 daily flex passes have been sold year to date compared to 1,309 last year. The program is serving 232 individual registrants.



- Awesome Adventure Camp has 276 individual participants registered compared to 240 individuals this time last year.
- The Teenie Weenie Princess Ball was held on April 20 at Fountain View Recreation Center. 79 children were registered with a total of 171 attendees (including parents). Participants enjoyed performances and had photo and autograph opportunities with 11 princesses.



• The adult Mystery Trip to Harley Davison Museum took place on April 4.



• The adult trip to Dancing Horses took place on April 10.



• On April 10-11, the Carol Stream Library came to read stories to the preschoolers.

- Adult Cup in Hand Kickball league has 6 total teams as oppose to the 12 last year.
- Adult Softball Leagues have 40 total teams this year, down 1 team compared to last year.
- 5 Star Soccer ran a one-day clinic on Sunday, April 14, and had a total of 24 participants. This first time clinic was developed to help boost the youth soccer program by including additional skill development prior to the season starting.
- CSYTBA (Travel Basketball) donated funds to the Carol Stream Park District in order to purchase

  programming along with rentals for the new shooting machine.
