 Summer Camp is at capacity for most weeks through the summer. Recreation and Registration Services staff have been working closely to monitor cancellations, to accommodate as many children on the waitlist.

- Walter Park the park is basically completed. There are a few very minor issues left to rectify such as re-setting the bases on the ball field. The grand opening is scheduled on Monday, June 24.
- Community Park the remaining items are flag pole installation, park name sign
 installation, sand added to the sand volleyball court, basketball nets on all hoops, goals put
 inside the futsal court and some re-grading on the native area adjacent to the parking lot.
- The grand opening of the Armstrong Park pickleball courts was held on June 5. A ribbon cutting, free tournament, and free demos were held. Senator Seth Lewis was in attendance for the ribbon cutting. Attendees received a giveaway and free concessions items.
 Approximately 200 community members were in attendance. The Daily Herald also did a nice follow up article about the new courts. Since then, the courts have been full every day.

Foster a Safe and Welcoming Environment

- HR Coordinator submitted driver abstract requests to the State of Illinois for our eligible drivers. This is done annually to ensure that all staff who drive company vehicles still have a valid Illinois Driver's license and meet the guidelines of our vehicle safety policies and procedures.
- The AED by the Gymnastics Hallway at Simkus had a faulty battery. We received a free replacement battery and put the AED back in use.
- The box for the outdoor AED at McCaslin has been ordered. More details to follow once it arrives and is installed.
- Opening Day at Coral Cove Water Park was held on May 25. Highlights of the day were a DJ, games, a fitness demo, and concessions samples.

Participation numbers in popular group fitness classes continues to average over 9
participants per class. May Fitness Fun Class "Soothing Waves Yoga" was a success, bringing
in 12 participants (five more than usual).



- The 500 Mile Challenge began on January 1 and has 137 members participating. 4 members have completed 500 miles.
- The May Member Challenge began on May 1 with 126 members participating in the challenge. All-Inclusive members were asked to workout at the Fountain View Fitness Center 12 times with a chance to be in a drawing for a \$50 Lowes Gift Card. 74 Members completed the challenge. Nick P was our May challenge winner.



- The June member challenge asks members to complete 12 workouts in the month of June. We currently have 149 members participating. This is almost double the participation from 2023 which reported only 78 members participating.
- A diverse selection of registration based classes continue to be of interest with over 51
 participants in Better Balance and Fall Prevention, Martial Arts Conditioning, Relax and Roll,
 Speed & Agility Training, and two Train for 5K! classes. This is an increase from only 26 class
 participants in classes offered in 2023.

- The Before & After School Care Program already has 839 registrations for the coming school year; this is slightly lower than 868 at this time last year. The program is serving 235 individual participants.
- Preschool graduation was held on May 15 at Fountain View Recreation Center. 62 children graduated to kindergarten this year.



• Graduating preschoolers and their families were invited to Coyote Crossing Mini Golf on May 17 for a free round of mini golf and an ice cream treat.



• Before & After School Care ended on May 23 for the 2023-2024 school year.

- All Preschool Lead and Assistant Instructors, Camp Coordinators, and Camp Leads are now trained in CPR and First Aid.
- Gymnastics staff attended a two day training to improve coaching skills. Topics covered
 included types of learning, types of listening along with cues and commands for effective
 listening, hands-on trainings for new warm-ups, and methods to keep classes active.
- HR onboarded over 50 new and returning Camp Counselors for the summer 2024 season.
